Background and Experience

Please briefly present your organization

Budapest Association for International Sports (BAIS) is a volunteer-based, non-profit organization with the mission of promoting physical activity, intercultural understanding, solidarity, environmental protection and sustainability through sport-based non-formal education.

Starting in 2014 we developed our activities as an informal group of young people under the name of the International Sport Association of Budapest (ISAB). In December 2017 we were registered as a not-for-profit association by the court of Budapest (Hungary). The primary goal of our organization is to advance participation in grassroots sports activities and support the development of healthy attitudes among young people regardless of their origin and social status. The secondary goal is to bring people together through the shared passion for sports and physical activity, therefore our motto is “building bridges through sport”.

Our target group includes international and Hungarian students, young professionals, and disadvantaged youngsters. Through the organization of free and accessible recreational activities, youth exchanges, training courses, and sports camps, and with the help of 50 active young members and initiative takers, we create learning mobility opportunities and strengthen mutual understanding and friendship among people of different origins.

Our long and strong experience with the Erasmus+ program started almost 7 years ago,

in 2016. Since then we have organized and partnered in more than 19 projects in different thematic programs, mainly in Erasmus+ Youth and Erasmus+ sports. Our expertise has made us a very reliable organization for our partners: after sending more than 250 active youth representing BAIS in various projects, whom has brought back with them a lot of experiences, ideas, and dissemination activities.

What are the activities and experiences of the organisation in youth work? Please provide information on your organisation's / group's regular youth work activities.

Budapest Association for International Sports was created by young people having significant international experience behind their backs coupled with a love for physical activity. Our organization developed strong international relations and we have significant experience in international project management. We utilize sport for social development purposes; we promote social inclusion, solidarity, mutual understanding, and active citizenship through sport-based education. Our members and volunteers have participated in various youth and sport-related training courses, seminars, study visits, and youth exchanges all over the world. Some of our members have been actively involved in the organization of international youth exchanges and training courses during which they developed their project management competencies. Besides being sending organization for a number of Erasmus+ youth exchanges and training courses, we developed and implemented youth projects starting in 2016:

Since 2019 BAIS has been actively engaged in Erasmus+ sports projects and has contributed to several initiatives and coordinated three small collaborative partnerships (Roma Inclusion through Sports in Europe - RISE, Reinventing Sporting Traditions - ReSport, United through Urban Movement - UUM). Within the framework of the EYESS collaborative partnership, our association organized an inclusive sports event named Mondiali Sports Festival 2020 including more than 300 participants representing 50 different nationalities. From 2021 our strategy focuses more on the promotion of sustainability and environmental protection through sports and physical activity, the inclusion of disadvantaged groups such as youngsters with physical disabilities, and awareness raising on the importance of mental and physical health not only among young people but older as well. In order to promote environmental protection through sports-based education, we launched different youth and sports collaborations, such as the Play for Sustainable Environment (P4SE) capacity-building project or the Green Education through Sports (GETS) Erasmus+ Sport project.

President - Bence Garamvolgyi: Bence is responsible for overseeing international projects at BAIS. He has several years of experience in the field of project management, having volunteered and worked for public and civil society organizations across Europe. Bence has an MA degree in International Relations and in 2015 he was selected as a Blue Book trainee for the European Commission's DG EAC Sport Unit. After returning from Brussels he served two years as a policy officer for EU sport and youth affairs at the Hungarian Ministry of Human Capacities and another two years as policy and project manager at ENGSO Youth, the youth body of the European Non-Governmental Sports Organization. His Ph.D. research concerns the utilization of sport in public diplomacy. He speaks English and Italian fluently and he has good communication knowledge of Spanish and French.

Vice President - Barnabas Vagany: Barnabas successfully obtained a BSc degree in Psychology from Glasgow Caledonian University in 2012. He has been active in practicing sports from a young age, including competing in swimming and judo as well as teaching swimming. His love for engaging in physical activities and sports has only

grown stronger over the years. As part of the founding members of the International Sport Association of Budapest, Barnabas is engaged in promoting physical exercise and community building through sports, on a daily basis, for internationals and Hungarians alike. Barnabas also had the opportunity to participate in the youth exchange program for social inclusion and intercultural learning through sports funded by the EU initiative, Erasmus+.

Board member - Amine Mseddi: Interested in sports and cultural exchange, I became an active member of civil society, being a part of "Sfax Outdoor Sports" in my hometown and then in "Budapest Association for International Sports" and I recently got elected as a member of the Presidency Board. With BAIS, I helped organize local events and participated as a team leader in several international youth programs. The aim is mainly to use sports as a medium to promote social inclusion and a healthy lifestyle. I am also a TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language) certified English teacher and mentor. As a part of Angloville, I took part in many English camps and workshops with kids, teenagers, and adults in a non-formal education framework. I also have a small experience as a graphic designer and photo editor and consider myself an amateur doodle artist. I speak fluent Arabic, French, and English and very basic German and Hungarian.

Project Coordinator - Alaaddine Alrifai: Lifetime Learner with more than 7 years of experience in Business Management and Development in different sectors and fields, with 2 MSc, one in Leadership and one in Marketing. Passion for knowledge and skills development has driven him to always look for new opportunities, where he can learn and discover more. With a big experience in youth-led activities and projects, he has participated in many international events to represent his country and his organizations on different platforms, in different European and regional countries, as well as being an active volunteer in many organizations with different roles. He speaks fluent English and Arabic, Good French.

Erika Juhasz: Erika is a graduate of Sports Management studies at Eötvös Loránd University, with NGO and public sector experience in Hungary, spending a one-year internship at the Hungarian Competitive Sports Federation. As a member of the Budapest Association for International Sports, Erika has participated in the project management of Erasmus+ Youth Exchanges and participated in sport-themed KA1 mobility projects. Youth Exchanges are at the intersection of Erika's primary interests - sports, youth, and non-formal education, the main interests are around active citizenship and inclusion.
